

QUICK FACTS* CleanBC GO ELECTRIC REBATES PROGRAM

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Purchaser/lessee of vehicle is an individual, business, non-profit, or public sector organization that is based in British Columbia or has a B.C.-based affiliate. All businesses must be licensed to operate in B.C.

MAXIMUM REBATE AMOUNT

- On-Road Heavy-Duty Class 8 Vehicles: CAD\$150,000, or 33% of the purchase price of the vehicle, whichever is lower
- Any eligible organization may receive a maximum of 10 rebates from the program. Requests for more than 10 rebates will be considered on a case-by-case basis

STACKING

- B.C. businesses and non-profit organizations looking to purchase or lease a new medium- or heavy duty zero emission vehicle are allowed to stack the federal iMHZEV rebates with provincial funding support
- Stacking of funding from other government funding programs will be limited to 75% of eligible project costs, except in the case where the applicant is a local or indigenous government or their department agency in which case the stacking limit for government funding is 100% of the total project costs
- The stacking of provincial funding with other CleanBC Programs (for the same vehicles) is not permitted

LEASING

- Vehicles must be purchased or leased within Canada. Vehicles purchased outside Canada will not be eligible
- To qualify for the full value of the rebate, a minimum 36-month lease term is required

EVALUATION

- CleanBC Go Electric Rebates has a limited budget, all applications are subject to available program funds
- Application must be submitted within 90 days of purchasing vehicle in order to be eligible for the rebate

OPERATION REQUIREMENTS

- To receive a vehicle rebate the vehicle must remain plated, registered, and insured in British Columbia in the applicant's name for at least 36 months from date of sale for on-road heavy-duty vehicles



- If before the 36-month period is up, the applicant does not abide by all of the above conditions, the applicant will be required to repay the full amount of the rebate awarded

COMMENTS

- The vehicle rebate enables the purchaser or lessee of an eligible specialty-use vehicle to receive a post-purchase rebate
- The rebate is applied to the purchase or lease price of the vehicle after all applicable costs and taxes have been applied
- When applying to the program, a copy of a valid B.C. business license must be provided if applicable
- Applicants are also required to submit at the time of application a WorkSafeBC number, valid (not expired) government-issued identification of the applicant, and one or more recent utility bills
- Purchaser/lessee must provide a complete and final bill of sale when submitting the application form including the VIN, make and model of vehicle, name and address of purchaser/lessee, purchase date and purchase price
- If a vehicle is not new, has been re-leased, is the subject of a lease assumption, is a demonstrator vehicle, or has been transferred into B.C. after previously having been registered out of province, the vehicle is not eligible for a rebate through the program
